The Greenwood Centre (as it was then known) opened to the public by Dafydd Wigley MP and presented with Prince of Wales Award by Prince Charles. Opened as an education centre with the main attraction being "The World of Trees" Exhibition.	24th May 1993

Jungle Boat Adventure and Mini-Tractor rides opened.	2002
Forest Theatre and Toddlers' Village opened. Extensive improvements to site. GreenWood celebrated its 10th anniversary and became Greenwood Forest Park Ltd. Won People section of the Forestry Commission's 'Woods for Wales 2003 Awards' for North Wales.	2003
Green Dragon family roller coaster opened. More extensive improvements to site. Café and Snowdon Snacks refurbished and extended, Theatre Snacks opened.	2004
The eco-friendly technology behind its Green Dragon roller coaster won the Park its Best use of Technology award as part of Responsible Travel's Responsible Tourism Awards.	2005
Crocodile Maze opened in March and willow was planted within. A Port Talbot company completed construction of TreeTop Towers. Gareth and Lowri of S4C's Planed Plant opened the attraction in May.	2006

A Rain Water Harvesting System, devised by two local men, was installed to capture the rain from the Great Hall's roof. The rain collected replaces 20% of the water needed to flush the WCs on the Park. The Giant Jumper - Wales's first bouncing pillow is unveiled. Tunnel Warren is opened for the under 7s .	2007
Moon Karts track built – the pedal carts prove to be very popular with all ages. Junglesnax Snack Bar opened	2008
BareFoot Trail is opened – the first one in Wales and only the second one in the UK. GreenWood Owners Stephen and Andrea Bristow gained their MBEs for services to tourism in North Wales.	2009
LittleForest PlayBarn built for the 0 to 3 year olds. Great undercover fun, provides a really good time for our youngest visitors.	2010
Zipadeedoodah – 2 small zip wires – is constructed near TreeTop Towers.	2011
Said goodbye to "The World of Trees" exhibition to make way for The Enchanted WoodBarn indoor soft play area and new café. This gave the Park the opportunity to have all year opening with just the play area being open during the winter months.	2012
The WildWEB a six metre tall double mast rope pyramid, was officially launched by local school children from Ysgol Parc Y Bont.	April 2014
